



Internship Requirements

Time Commitment:

- All “credit” interns must complete a minimum of 120 contact hours. Once a 120 hours is reached they may continue the internship until a maximum of 520 contact hours is reached.
- All “non-credit” interns must complete a minimum of 160 contact hours. Once a 160 hours is reached they may continue the internship until a maximum of 520 hours is reached.

Before an intern completes the minimum number hours they must have completed:

- IS 100
- IS 200
- IS 700
- IS 800
