


























This is Penny and she would like to teach you all she knows about building an emergency kit.
















- · Make sure your emergency kit is easily accessible should you need it, this means it is close to you or easy to get quickly should you need it.
- · Make sure your toys and games do not require electricity because there may not be power.

- If you take any medicine make sure you have enough for at least 72 hours.

  - If you bring can food make sure to bring a can opener.





















