This is Penny and she would like to teach you all she knows about building an emergency kit.

Things to Remember:


- Your emergency kit should have supplies that can last up to 72 hours.
- Make sure your emergency kit is easily accessible should you need it, this means it is close to you or easy to get quickly should you need it.
- Make sure your toys and games do not require electricity because there may not be power.
 - Card games, coloring books, etc. are great things to keep in your kit
- Always keep extra batteries in your kit for your flashlight and radio.
- If you take any medicine make sure you have enough for at least 72 hours.
- If you have pets they will need their own emergency kit too.
 - If you bring can food make sure to bring a can opener.
